Note for parents and carers:

One of the most important aspects of this strand of the curriculum is that children learn how to spell and use the past and progressive tense of verbs correctly. For most words, this simply means adding the suffix 'ed' or 'ing'. However, there are spelling rules for how some words change before the suffix is added. Children often find the 'ed' suffix difficult as in some words it sounds like /d/ (e.g. banged) or /t/ (e.g. walked). In addition, some verbs are 'irregular' – they don't follow the rules.

Children also need to develop the ability to use tense consistently and correctly in longer pieces of writing, and to recognise inconsistencies when proofreading their own and others' work.

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Spelling Rules 1

First we will practice how some verbs change when we add 'ed' to make the past tense. Remember the spelling rules:

- most verbs just add 'ed';
- verbs that end in 'e' take away the 'e' and add 'ed';
- verbs that end in consonant then 'y', change the 'y' to 'i' and add 'ed' (although not for verbs that end ay/ey/oy);
- verbs with a short vowel and single consonant – double the consonant and add 'ed'.

Spelling Rules 2

The progressive tense happens when the suffix 'ing' is added, and it shows something that is happening over a period of time. For example: 'I am talking to my friend' or 'he was eating his dinner'.

Again, there are rules for how the spelling of verbs change when 'ing' is added:

- most verbs just add 'ing';
- all verbs that end in 'y' just add 'ing';
- verbs that end in 'e' take off the 'e' then add 'ing';
- verbs with short vowel and a single consonant double the last consonant and add 'ing'.
