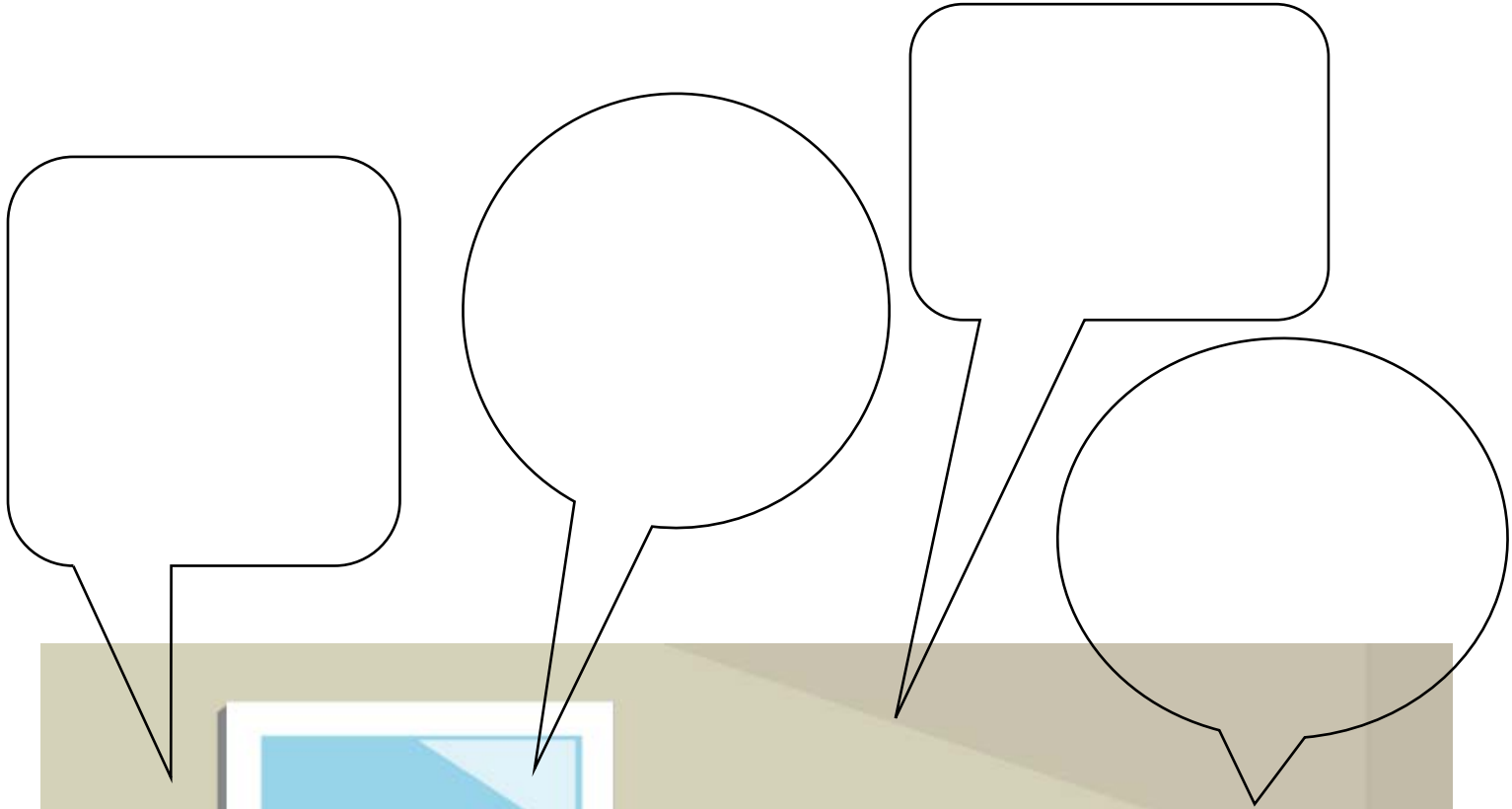


What did they say?
