



Have some fun with water!

Wet Sponge Tag - Starting with a soaked sponge, the first person tags another person by tossing the sponge at another player to make them "It." Remember don't aim for the face!

Water Balloon Piñata - Fill balloons with water, tie them up and string between two trees or along a clothesline. Take turn striking the balloons with a stick. Estimate how many strikes it will take to burst the balloons.

Squeeze the Sponge Relay –

Get a sponge and 2 buckets, one filled with water and one empty. The object of the game is to transfer the water from bucket to bucket using the sponge. Whoever does it the fastest is the winner. What will you use to record each players time?

Organise your own outdoor talent show like the one Tiny Ant competed in. Get all the members of your family to join in. You could sing a song, dance to music, tell jokes, read a book.



Will there be a prize for the winner? Who is going to be the judge? What will you use to make the stage, your family will perform on?

If the weather turns bad or the grown-ups ask you to come inside for a while, you could explore minibeasts with Jess on Cbeebies.

Go on your own bug hunt and then create an information poster or booklet about what you found. This could include drawings of the bugs you found. Plan a mini Olympics or sports day. Write a list (do not forget to use bullet points) of all the events and races. You could include an egg and spoon race, a skipping/hopping/jumping/running race, or a blanket relay!



Use a tape measure or stick to measure out the track. You could award points to each event and then add them up using the 'counting on' method at the end. This will tell you who the overall winner is. Maybe you could make and then award the winner with a medal or trophy.
