Attendance so far!

On Tuesday across the city attendance was at 92% with 30,000 pupils attending school. I am delighted to say that we hit 96% and are hoping to keep it that way! Well done everyone.

Safety during drop-off and pick-up

Priority entrance will be given to families queueing towards the leisure centre. Please do not queue the other way down Hamelin Rd as the entrance queue will block the exit gate – this is not safe in terms of social distancing. Thanks you so much for your patience and understanding with this.

Parking – do not park along the pavement where families are queueing. There were at least 2 near misses when inconsiderate parents in cars mounted the pavement to park, narrowly missing children queueing to get into school. We will notify police of number plates if this continues.

PE days

Following the Operations Procedure and Risk Assessments, pupils are not able to get changed for PE in class. So that they can take part in PE, we request that you send your child to school wearing their PE kit (including tracksuit/jogging bottoms if it's cold and appropriate footwear) Please see the days below:

Thursday – Year 5 and 2
Friday – Year 6

No spare kit is available so it is essential that you ensure your child wears their kit on the right day.


Cashless System – ParentPay

Thank you for sending your children with named, full water bottles — a reminder that they should only contain water and not juice. It is essential that pupils have water available so please do continue to send these every day.
