**Royal Visit to Leicester City Football Club** On Wednesday 28<sup>th</sup> November, their Royal Highnesses, the Duke and Duchess of Cambridge, visited Leicester City Football Club to pay tribute to the victims of the helicopter accident on Saturday 27<sup>th</sup> October. The Club Chairman, Vichai Srivaddhanaprabha, was among the 5 people who tragically lost their lives. In the days following the tragedy, thousands of tributes were laid outside the stadium. The Club asked for volunteers to help relocate the tributes prior to Leicester's home fixture against Burnley. A member of Queensmead staff who is a season ticket holder and long-standing fan, volunteered to help. She was both surprised and delighted to receive an unexpected invitation from the football club to attend the royal visit. She had a brief chat and shook hands with both the Duke and Duchess.
